Announcement:

Change in painting sizes for ACACA shows.

- 1. Size regulations of two dimensional art submitted at Zone Shows have changed as of August 2016 AGM. Artists may now submit up to 3 pieces, outside framed size of each must be no larger than 1280 square inches (Height inches x Width inches = Square inches) at \$10 each.
- 2. Size regulations for each piece of sculpture is no larger than 20"x20", and weigh no more than 25 lbs. Up to 3 pieces may be submitted at \$10 each.

Farewell Penny

Penny Volk passed away on September 24 after 4 months illness with Pancreatic Cancer. Linda reflected that when she last saw her, Penny recounted the many wonderful people she met through the ACACA. Yes, we are a family of Artists.



As we go through our lives, there are so many twists and turns that take us here and there. We walk through doors which change our lives and as we look back we wonder what would be different, had we walked through a different door. When I was 12, I joined a group of ladies who spent Wednesday evenings in the basement of Lois Valle's house for art lessons. I was the youngest member. I went for a couple of vears and then started an art course by correspondance. Through the years, I always remembered those days and the tiny basement where we all huddled, painting and I listened to their conversations. They would talk about the weather, and how their

feet would ache or itch when the weather changed. They would gossip about people in the community and would talk about what each artist could do to improve their individual paintings. We could say, there was a critique at every art night. I enjoyed those nights and enjoy, to this day, getting together with fellow artists to "chew the fat". Lois was a member of the Newell Art Club along with other people from the area, Penny Volk was also a member of this club and she would take her art outside. Her favorite past time was going to a location, preferably the badlands, Bow River, Writing on Stone Park and elsewhere, including locations in and around their farm. She fondly recounted to me that she would even tell her children when they were little, that they were going on a picnic and a paint out. This was a fun time and she pointed out that sometimes the children would rather explore than paint. Penny continued to Plein Aire Paint up until this past summer at the Badlands and some of the members of Sage Brush Arts Society joined her. She brought the knowledge to share when it comes to painting in the elements. She showed patience, when she spilled her paint thinner and she showed stamina and staying power when it came to sitting there trying to capture the scene before the long shadows of darkness started to sweep over the hills and valleys. Newell Art Club closed its doors and we saw the birth of a new art club in Brooks, naming it Sage

Brush Arts. Penny was estatic as she had wanted to be involved in another art club. She was also a member of ACACA for many years and served on the Board. The members of this new club respected Penny and her knowledge she had to share. We welcomed her at the shows and she was always a helping hand whenever and wherever she could. All this, when she wasn't in Arizona taking it easy and golfing. In May of this year at the Southern Zone show, we learned of Penny's illness and we got together to have a solo show for her, in her honor and to formally recognize her for her contribution to the Art in the community. She was Passionate and Dedicated and at her opening night of the show, I presented her with the Penny Volk Lifetime Achievement Award from the ACACA. She was the first recipient of this award, which was made in her honor. The next day she told me that this was one of the most wonderful awards she could have ever gotten. I am glad that I walked through certain doors which led me to know Penny. She passed away today and she will be missed, but not forgotten. Her name and her broad range of paintings which she has completed of the Canadian Badlands will live on forever. That is part of her legacy. This is Penny Volk.

In 2016, the northern Zone show was hosted by the Art club in Bonnyville, Central Zone show was in Lacombe and the Southern Zone show was in Brooks. I am inviting your art club to please consider stepping up to the plate and Host a Zone show in your designated zone. The theme this year will be "150 years in the making". Those hosting the show will receive up to \$1000 for the rental of the venue for this show. If you decide to have a "silent auction" and that is very beneficial, half of the proceeds of the silent auction are kept by the hosting club as well as, half of all registrations. And, you get to meet many wonderful artists in your Zones (Northern, Central and Southern).

The Art Club in Brooks, who hosted the Southern Zone show in 2016, included along with the Juried show, a separate area for local artisans who don't fit the criteria of the ACACA. In this area of the same building, was a display of Pottery, Photography, Jewellery, cards etc. to round out the show. Sage Brush Arts members who wanted to display more of their Art Pieces were able to do so upstairs apart from the Juried ACACA show. There was also a gift shop where all ACACA members who participated in the Southern Zone show could bring extra pieces of Art to sell which had a price tag of \$150 and under. This added event went over quite nicely and it was felt that, through this exercise, more art lovers attended the show.

We look forward to hearing from you and working with you in 2017 and many years to come as we introduce more and more artists to the viewing public. As well, 2018 is the year of our 50th Anniversary and you can contact anyone on the Board as, we are looking for clubs to host these Zone shows as well. No need to feel overwhelmed at the task as there is a Manuel to follow, all Board members have worked these shows, and with this extensive experience; we are there to lend a helping hand. - provide the ACACA with an article to be printed in the newsletter about their experience and use of the grant.

Application deadline is midnight, October 31st. Applications received after this date will not be accepted.

FACULTY OF EXTENSION LILLIAN NUNN SCHOLARSHIP

The Lillian Nunn scholarships are funded by the interest portion of monies bequeathed to the Faculty of Extension at the University of Alberta by the late Mrs. Lillian Nunn of Lacombe, an A.C.A.C.A. member who died in 1982.

It was Lillian Nunn's wish that her bequest be used to provide scholarships to A.C.A.C.A. members 50 years of age or older, and that the selection of scholarship winners be at the sole discretion of the Faculty of Extension. Scholarships will be awarded annually, in an amount not less than \$300.00, to assist recipients with expenses to further their art or art education.

Individuals maybe awarded a Lillian Nunn Scholarship by one of two methods:

- 1) The instructors of the Faculty of Extension Pine Arts Program will submit the names and portfolios of persons who have excelled in these courses and who meet the age and A.C.A.C.A. membership requirements. These portfolios will consist of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years.
- 2) A.C.A.C.A. members who meet the age requirement, but are not enrolled in a Faculty of Extension Fine Arts Program may apply for a scholarship by completing an application form and submitting a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years directly to the Lillian Nunn Scholarship Application do Liberal Studies, Faculty of Extension, University of Alberta, 2-200 Enterprise Square, 10230 Jasper Avenue, Edmonton, AB, T5J 4P6.
