As you know, the residents of Fort McMurray are in the process of rebuilding not only homes but also their lives in general.

The earlier response to a previous letter was lovely as many of you want to donate a piece of original art work to the families of Ft. Mac. We know the value of original art exceeds the price. The true value is the energy it brings to home and we know this will aid in their rebuilding and healing.

Fort McMurray's Health Care Centres are reporting that most of the residents are dealing with some level of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder from deep depression to headaches and anxiety. This is true for the children as well as the adults. We have seen the benefits of the arts involvement in rebuilding communities and as visual artist we would like to do our part. Our goal is to provide a piece of original art for the residents who wish to participate.

Basic information:

- All forms of visual art are acceptable – paintings, photography, sculpture, wall hangings, pottery, woodwork, stone carving – as long as it is original.
- The artist is asked to photograph their display ready artwork and send this to us as a jpg along with your name, address and value. We will have a form created on our website for you to use. You will receive a tax receipt.

12. Linda Wilson advised the membership that we are seeking Zone Show Hosts for the Northern, Central and Southern Zones for 2017. It is important that the Host Clubs vary from year to year, thus sparking renewed interest in the artists within those different areas of Alberta. Art clubs must host a show within 10 years to be eligible for workshop grants. We also would like new clubs to join the ACACA.

FACULTY OF EXTENSION LILLIAN NUNN SCHOLARSHIP

The Lillian Nunn scholarships are funded by the interest portion of monies bequeathed to the Faculty of Extension at the University of Alberta by the late Mrs. Lillian Nunn of Lacombe, an A.C.A.C.A. member who died in 1982.

It was Lillian Nunn's wish that her bequest be used to provide scholarships to A.C.A.C.A. members 50 years of age or older, and that the selection of scholarship winners be at the sole discretion of the Faculty of Extension. Scholarships will be awarded annually, in an amount not less than \$300.00, to assist recipients with expenses to further their art or art education.
