with the ACACA, and holding Plein Air workshops of her own at the Badlands. She was also an integral member of the Newell Art Club in Brooks, and then has been with Sage Brush Arts since its creation.

The weekend of June 17 and 18, Sage Brush Arts Society hosted a showing of some of her paintings in Brooks at the CPR Engineers Heritage Home owned and operated by Kathy and Armand Ramer. Kathy served scones and Saskatoon pie, with tea and coffee on the veranda and was a most gracious host for the two days. It was a wonderful time, attended and supported very well by members of the community. There were over 50 paintings there on display, the majority depicting the Canadian Badlands and scenes from southern Alberta, as well as Penny's beautiful hand crafted jewelry on display. To see the reaction to this large show by the attendees was overwhelming indeed. Sage Brush Arts, member Richard Wood presented her with a dozen red roses, and Sage Brush Arts Society President Linda Milne recalled many paint outs and good times with Penny. Linda LaRoche-Wilson, President of ACACA, presented Penny with the newly approved Penny Volk Lifetime Achievement Award, dated Friday, June 17, 2016, for Passion, Dedication and Service to the Arts and ACACA. It is a great tribute to Penny and very well received. Molly Douglass, County Reeve then opened the show and reception.

Penny went home with 15 fewer paintings, some of which were purchased by the Community Centre

at Rolling Hills, The Mayor of the City of Brooks, the County of Newell Reeve, and the President of the Canadian Badlands. It was decided by a large number of attendees at the opening night that Penny Volk is more than likely the only artist in the world who has painted such a large collection of Badlands scenes, as she had many more at home that did not make it into the solo show. I am pretty sure that she is just that artist with this distinction.

At 82, Penny hosted a Plein Air workshop at the Badlands near Brooks and I was told that she would trundle up and down the hills, all over, to find the perfect spot to spread out with her stool, easel, canvas and art supplies to set up and paint. Pat Neufeld, the now Southern Zone Rep and Linda Milne, President of Sage Brush Arts Society were very lucky to be included in this marvelous experience of seeing

nature in all its glory and putting it to canvas alongside Penny Volk.

Penny, you are a 'gem' to all of us and may you paint many more Badlands scenes for all to see.

I want to thank all of the members of the Executive, the Board of Directors, and you, as members for all of your cooperation and volunteer hours you put into keeping the ACACA running. I hope to see you all at the AGM in August.







Beware!

ART FRAUD PURCHASERS

This is a “heads up” to all of you who may have been contacted from someone from Europe, England or Africa with interests in a painting of yours.


What happens is you get an email and the person wants to purchase one of your “beautiful” paintings. He will ask you what the price is (\$500 or whatever your price is) and then get your address. Then he will mail a money order out to you for \$2000.15 and tell you that a man who he has entrusted to pick up the painting and deliver it to him will look after that.

He wants to know your actual address so that this courier person can come to your door. The purchaser will tell you to give him the painting

along with \$1500 from the \$2000 that he sent you so that he can make sure that the painting arrives to him safely. He wants all this done immediately before you get the money order that looks like this below.

This so called bank does not exist even though it is closely numbered to one in Montreal. However, I

phoned the Laurentian Bank in Montreal and they said that this is a scam and do not get caught up in it. A lot of people have, and it happens so quick, they do not even realize it until it is too late. So..... sellers beware. If it is too good to be true, it is!!!!!!!!!!!!

ALBERTA COMMUNITY ART CLUBS ASSOCIATION INDIVIDUAL WORKSHOP GRANT

The purpose of this grant is to offer individual members of the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association \$400.00 to assist in furthering their knowledge and education within the field of Fine Arts.

Only three grants will be available annually and only to members in good standing with the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association. Selection will be based on the member's merit and eligibility within their field of study as well as their involvement within the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association. Members who have received any other scholarships or grants through the A.C.A.C.A. within the past year are not eligible. This grant application excludes the Executive and Directors of the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association.

To apply for this Grant, members must submit the following:

- personal statement as to why they are applying and how the grant will be used;
- curriculum vitae or biography;
- 5 slides or photographs of their work; **please include a self-addressed stamped envelope for the return of photos**

A panel of three from outside the ACACA will review applications.

Upon receipt of their grant, successful candidates must:

- use the funds within a 12 month period.
- provide the ACACA with an article to be printed in the newsletter about their experience and use of the grant.

Application deadline is midnight, October 31st. Applications received after this date will not be accepted.

Successful recipients will be notified in writing by December 31.

FACULTY OF EXTENSION LILLIAN NUNN SCHOLARSHIP

The Lillian Nunn scholarships are funded by the interest portion of monies bequeathed to the Faculty of Extension at the University of Alberta by the late Mrs. Lillian Nunn of Lacombe, an A.C.A.C.A. member who died in 1982.

It was Lillian Nunn's wish that her bequest be used to provide scholarships to A.C.A.C.A. members 50 years of age or older, and that the selection of scholarship winners be at the sole discretion of the Faculty of Extension. Scholarships will be awarded annually, in an amount not less than \$300.00, to assist recipients with expenses to further their art or art education.

Individuals may be awarded a Lillian Nunn Scholarship by one of two methods:

- 1) The instructors of the Faculty of Extension Pine Arts Program will submit the names and portfolios of persons who have excelled in these courses and who meet the age and A.C.A.C.A. membership requirements.
