St. Albert Painters' Guild (SAPG) reached out to local school boards to request any schools interested in starting an Art Club at their school write the Guild a letter to apply for support and funding. Only two schools applied to the new initiative spearheaded by SAPG President Berni Buyse. Christmas came early for Wild Rose School in St. Albert and Legal School in Legal thanks to the generosity of SAPG.

Francine Cressall, Fine Arts Teacher at Wild Rose School in St. Albert was thrilled to receive the donation of \$250.00 from SAPG on November 20, 2019. Francine said the funds would enable her to purchase art materials that she does not normally have access to.

Francine loved the idea to pay it forward by a collaborative painting on the canvas presented to her, which will be sold at the SAPG 2020 Fall Show to raise funds for another school's art program.

Francine was photographed with one of her student's art projects, "Four Views of a Cat." She will be sending SAPG photos when her students begin working on the canvas. Diane Stone presented Francine at Wild Rose School with the canvas and donation of funds.

Legal School was the second recipient of a cheque for \$250.00 plus a blank canvas from the SAPG to kick start their new Art Club presented by (L to R) Jill Swann-Lussier; SAPG Secretary to Principal Renee Trottier, Grade 4/5 Teacher Christina Doehring and Grade 5 Teacher Ashley Pelletier on November 22, 2019.

Students would like the new Art Club to start immediately however it will most likely start in the New Year. Doehring said, "Once you open up one door then there is so much more." The students interested in Art Club will get to try all kinds of art not just drawing or painting. Clay work, printmaking and other mediums will be explored. Legal School will also be creating a collaborative painting on the donated canvas to raise funds for another school's art program to be sold at the SAPG 2020 Fall Show.

Tessa Nunn's Workshop

MUSINGS ON TESSA NUNN'S WORKSHOP
'PORTRAITS FROM A LIVE MODEL',
August 9-10, 2019

This was the last of 4 workshops I attended through the generous scholarships of ACACA Lillian Nunn Individual grant.

Tessa's preview of the workshop promised to knock your socks off, and I am indeed barefoot.

The first morning was given to understanding the proportions of face, neck and shoulders. (see below) Model Scott Nunn posed and we applied drawing skills with graphic, charcoal, conte and relied on the traditional extended pencil to measure angles and distances. Silence prevailed. The sessions were broken up for coffee, lunch and model breaks to prevent artist fatigue.

Day 2, for those who stayed for the painting portion, (my choice was oils) began by transferring the drawing to canvas surface. By the way, beforehand the canvas receives several coats of gesso and needs 3 days drying time for gallery standards. Now to get down to colour. The streams of colour palette does not use blue. Instead, luscious olives and greens are mixed using black and earth tones, the yellow stream. Go figure.

As my painting progressed I was stymied by reliance on blending resulting in mud. Tessa came to my rescue, wiping the offending portion clean. Recovering from the initial shock, I realized this was just what was needed to start fresh by applying dabs of premixed colour. Luscious aubergines, olives, tans and flesh tones resulted in the deceptively dead palette. Tessa also suggested a put cerulean blue (as opposed to the hue) to make it really "pop".

Group critiques and valuable comments by Tessa gave us new eyes to improve.

We became environmentally conscious of the health concerns, using barrier cream for hands, walnut, poppy and safflower oil for cleaners and extenders. With 40 years of experience, Tessa walks the walk.

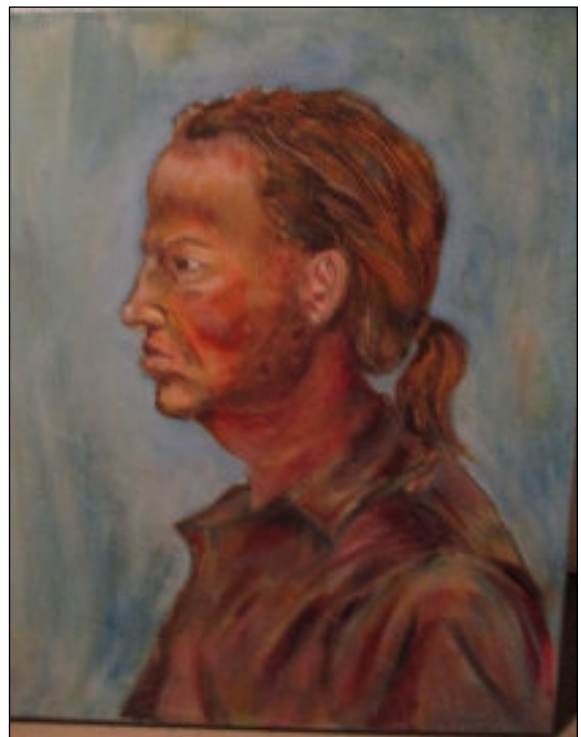
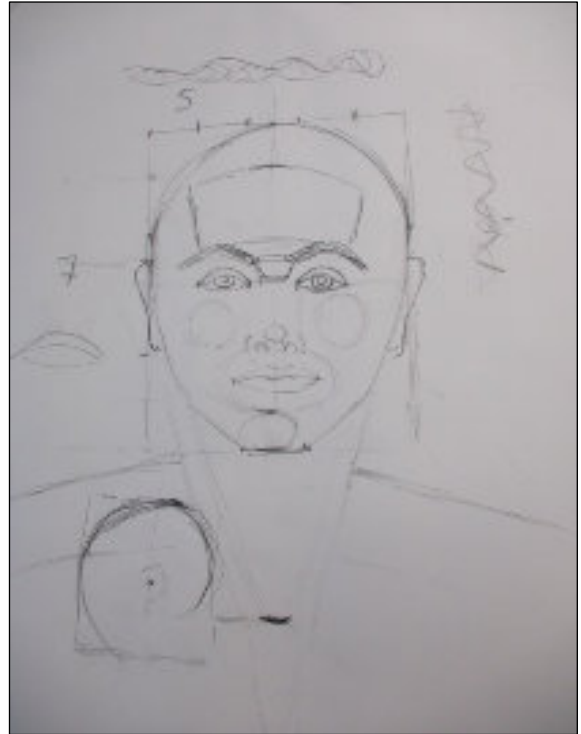
For artists disappointed with results from painting from photos, life drawing will give you better lighting, psychological effects and a greater range of flesh tones.

I was rewarded with a warm welcome from members of the Redwater Artists Society Jack and Ivy Twells, Lola Alsmo, Doreen Stachniak and husband and wife

team Scott and Tessa Nunn.

The only drawbacks were the tiring journey from Brooks to Redwater, and a side trip into rush hour Edmonton for supplies at Delta Art Supplies.
