Our Members Feedback

ACACA Show Survey – Feedback

Thanks to all of you who responded to the ACACA survey, sent in October and November electronically via survey monkey and through regular mail to those without email addresses.

We wanted your feedback on whether we should have shows in 2021 and what they should look like. We reviewed your responses at the AGM and again at our Zoom Board meeting on Saturday, November 21.

Here's what we learned:

- 50 members took the time to fill out the survey, YEAH!
- 89% of you want a show:
 - 68% thought it should be a live show with COVID protocols; 75% wanted online show(s);
 - A few people indicated they would not attend in person due to COVID, travel, or health concerns;
 - A few people felt they wouldn't be able to participate in a virtual show due to computer concerns;
 - 68% want shows to be juried and prizes awarded;
 - Critiquing was less important to members with 60% wanting it but many neutral (about 30%).
- Over 80% like the idea of showing their work in the newsletter.

Based on your feedback the ACACA Board has made the following decisions:

- <u>Shows will be held in 2021</u>! Board members are currently working out the details for a range of 2021 show options, with plans announced in the January newsletter.
- <u>Newsletters will increase!</u> Based on your interest in showing your work in our newsletters, we will increase production to every other month. So keep sending photos!

We will continue to respond to your feedback and comments, and thank you again to all who responded, we truly value your opinions and comments.

Your art in the newsletter:

Over 80% of you thought showing your art in the newsletter was a good idea - but I don't always get very many submissions! Here's what you need to know:

- When you photograph your work, it is usually better to do so before it is framed and preferably in daylight.
- Try to minimize glare or reflection try taking it from a little further back.
- Send it to me as a jpeg in as large a format as you can. If you're using a phone camera, it may ask what size you want say 'actual'.
- When I get it, unless it is of professional quality, I use photoshop to straighten it (if needed), resize, balance colours, etc.
- Be sure to tell me the size and medium. If you want to, feel free to add something about your inspiration or motivation.

If I get too many for the newsletter issue I'm working on, I'll save it for the next one – and we're *increasing the number of newsletters we're doing from 4 to 6*!

Your submission does not need to be new work! It is so important for us to keep in touch with each other and to see each other's work. I'm looking forward to seeing what you send!

From Carol von Gunten






From Donna Tugwood



ELIBIBILITY

ACACA members in good standing applying for the grant must:

- 1. be a sustaining member of the ACACA for three (3) years prior to applying for the grant;
- 2. hold a valid membership in the year the grant is being applied for;
- 3. show merit within their field of study;
- 4. sustain involvement at some level in the ACACA for the greater good of the association.

Members in good standing who have received any other scholarships or grants allocated through the ACACA in the past fiscal year are not eligible to apply in the year they have been recipients of other funding.

CRITERIA

Members who meet the eligibility requirements to be considered for an ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grant must:

- 1. complete the application form;
- 2. provide a current artist resume or CV;
- 3. attach a personal statement detailing why this grant is being applied for and how the funds will be used, and
- 4. submit a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed in the last 1-2 years (digital files or photos of the works are permissible for application purposes).

GRANT

Three (3) ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grants are available in each fiscal year (March 1 – February 28) in the amount of \$400.00 each.

- An accredited, non-partisan jury panel chosen by CARFAC Alberta will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- The ACACA Executive Board will review and confirm eligibility criteria of the applicants.
- Successful ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grant recipients will be notified by the ACACA Executive Board by December 31 and grant funds will be issued at that time.

Club Workshop Grant Criteria and Information

- Four workshops or paint-outs per zone will be entitled to a \$400 grant in each fiscal year, if the following criteria are met:
- 2. The Club must be a paid member and have hosted a Zone Show in the last ten (10) years.
- 3. a) Application deadline is July 31 of each year, late applications will be denied.
 - b) Applications will be processed in the order that they were received.
- 4. Preference will be given to clubs planning some sort of outreach beyond their membership.
- 5. A club or local group must be willing to accept responsibility for advertising, bookings, handling registrations, guaranteeing class size, providing overnight accommodation for instructor and securing local grant(s) if available.
- Some kind of outreach is encouraged, for example: invitations should be extended to persons from the community, older students in school and interested seniors.
- ACACA's sponsorship of the Workshop should be noted by having ACACA promotional materials available and given to the participants.
- 8. Applicants must submit the Workshop Grant Application form to the ACACA Treasurer for review and approval.
- 9. A minimum of eight (8) participants must be registered.
- 10. The club must submit the Workshop Report form to the ACACA Treasurer within 30 days of the completion or funds will be revoked.

*Any ACACA member or group of members that do not belong to a club may apply for this Workshop Grant, but must be pre-approved by the ACACA Board and must follow the same criteria as a club.

- ELIGIBILITY -

Preference will be given to students 50 years of age or older, who are members in good standing with the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association (ACACA).

- CRITERIA -

Individuals may be awarded a Lillian Nunn Scholarship by one of two methods:

- The Instructors of the Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program will submit the names and portfolios of persons who have excelled in these courses and who meet the age and ACACA membership requirements.
 - These portfolios will consist of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).
- 2. ACACA members who meet the age requirement but are not enrolled in a Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program may apply for this scholarship by completing an application form and submitting a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).

- SCHOLARSHIP -

Scholarships are available annually in an amount of no less than \$300, no more than \$600.

- Accredited faculty members at the U of A Faculty of Extension will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- Successful scholarship recipients of the Lillian Nunn Scholarship will be notified directly from Communications & Design, Faculty of Extension, University of Alberta.
