Grace Mary (Snell) McFadyen May 14, 1919 ~ April 14, 2021 (age 101)



Grace had a passion for art. She would spend many hours painting and sketching. She even blended her passions for art and animals

when she painted one of her horses. The picture is amazing and was displayed in her room at the extended care.

Grace became the ACACA president in 1983, afterwards becoming the historian for a number of years. She was also honored with a Life Time Achievement Award, this meant her membership was payed for life (she got her money's worth). Grace travelled southern Alberta to all the zone shows and the Alberta Wide, also to Edmonton for the Alberta General Meetings (in March). She took Harry Wohlfarth workshops, participated in paint outs, and created many paintings and friendships over the next fortythree years. Her love of art took her to Russia, Eastern Canada and the

Northern United States.

Grace lived rural, she lived on the prairies with its big, wide open skies, among her horses and farm land. She created using oils, pastels, pencil crayon, and graphite to show the beauty of the country. Grace used her livestock branding design as her signature on her art work. She enjoyed sharing her art and visiting with other ACACA artists.

Grace and Roy spent many winters in Osoyoos but after Roy's death Grace moved back to the farm north of Acadia Valley where she lived until 2013 when she had a stroke and moved to the Hanna Lodge. Grace made the move to the Oyen Long Term Care on April 9, 2015. It was at the extended care that Grace celebrated becoming Oyen's newest centenarian. Family and friends gathered at the Big Country Extended Care May 18, 2019 to celebrate this very special occasion with a party. Grace died April 14, 2021, at the extended care, one month shy of her 102 Birthday.

Mediums Vs. Additives

The world of products that can be added to acrylics to modify them for many different purposes can be a strange and confusing place. We understand that they essentially look like white products in white jars with white labels and it can be hard to understand why we have so many and what each of them do.

We have a lot of resources explaining the attributes of these products individually so will not go into every product here, but will concentrate on the difference between Mediums and Additives because the difference is a big one and especially using a product in the "Additives" category incorrectly could result in issues with the stability of your painting.

First let's define these terms.

What is a Medium? A medium is a complete and balanced formulation that contains an acrylic resin or "binder" and can be used on its own or added to acrylic paint or other mediums to extend paint or to change its working properties. The most important thing to mention is there is no danger of adding too much or too little medium into your paint and the medium can be used on its own. It can be helpful to think of them as paint without pigment. Mediums can be mixed with paint or other mediums, they can be mixed together,

layered with paint or other mediums and can be used as a size for canvas or a ground for painting with many painting materials. There aren't many rules when using most acrylics, which lessens the worry of using them incorrectly.

What is an Additive? An additive is a product that needs to be "added to" something. Under no circumstances should an additive be used on its own; it always needs to be mixed into a paint or medium. An Additive is volatile, meaning it will evaporate completely from the film during the curing process. Additives impart a different quality to the paint and each one has a very specific use. Some

additives are more like raw materials and do not contain any binder. It is important to follow the maximum addition recommendations on the label.







Radway, Newbrook ag societies Thorhild County is providing operating funds to the Newbrook and Radway Ag societies using the provincial COVID-19 grant. During its March 23 meeting council approved giving \$14,000 to the Newbrook Recreational and Agricultural Society and \$30,000 to the Radway Agricultural Society to assist them with their 2020-2021 operational shortfalls due to COVID-19 restrictions. See the COVID-19 restrictions are considered and costs," said reeve Kevin Grumetza "Hopefully next year they can operate and generate revenue."

County tops up support to

CAO Paul Hanlan said the county will provide financial support in the total amount of \$\$44,000 to the Radway and Newbrook Ag societies from the Annual Capital /Operating Allowance. Administratively, staff will then reimburse that account with monies from the Municipal Operating Support Transfer (MoST) grant.

The county cancess \$334,000 through the Theorem of \$MoST grant to assist with costs related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Assisting agricultural societies is an eligible grant expenditure.



The Lillian Nunn Scholarship is funded by an estate donation to the Faculty of Extension at the University of Alberta program by the late Lillian Nunn of Lacombe, AB. She was a member of the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association (ACACA) until her death in 1982. It was her bequest to provide scholarships to active ACACA members 50 years of age or older to assist with the furthering of their art education.

- ELIGIBILITY -

Preference will be given to students 50 years of age or older, who are members in good standing with the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association (ACACA).

- CRITERIA -

Individuals may be awarded a Lillian Nunn Scholarship by one of two methods:

- The Instructors of the Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program will submit the names and portfolios of persons who have excelled in these courses and who meet the age and ACACA membership requirements.
 - These portfolios will consist of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).
- ACACA members who meet the age requirement but are not enrolled in a Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program may apply for this scholarship by completing an application form and submitting a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).

- SCHOLARSHIP -

Scholarships are available annually in an amount of no less than \$300, no more than \$600.

- Accredited faculty members at the U of A Faculty of Extension will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- Successful scholarship recipients of the Lillian Nunn Scholarship will be notified directly from Communications & Design, Faculty of Extension, University of Alberta.

- · An accredited, non-partisan jury panel chosen by CARFAC Alberta will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- The ACACA Executive Board will review and confirm eligibility criteria of the applicants.
- Successful ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grant recipients will be notified by the ACACA Executive Board by December 31 and grant funds will be issued at that time.

Grant Criteria and Information

Art Clubs* that are members of the ACACA are entitled to four (4) workshop grants PER ZONE, per fiscal year in the amount of \$400.00. This grant includes paint-outs with instruction.

NOTE: This Application Form must by reviewed and approved by the ACACA Executive, please review the Application form carefully.

Club Workshop Grant Criteria and Information

- 1. Four workshops or paint-outs per zone will be entitled to a \$400 grant in each fiscal year, if the following criteria are
- 2. The Club must be a paid member and have hosted a Zone Show in the last ten (10) years.
- 3. a) Application deadline is July 31 of each year, late applications will be denied.
- b) Applications will be processed in the order that they were received.
- 4. Preference will be given to clubs planning some sort of outreach beyond their membership.
- 5. A club or local group must be willing to accept responsibility for advertising, bookings, handling registrations, guaranteeing class size, providing overnight accommodation for instructor and securing local grant(s) if
- 6. Some kind of outreach is encouraged, for example: invitations should be extended to persons from the community, older students in school and interested seniors.
- 7. ACACA's sponsorship of the Workshop should be noted by having ACACA promotional materials available and given to the participants.
- 8. Applicants must submit the Workshop Grant Application form to the ACACA Treasurer for review and approval.
- 9. A minimum of eight (8) participants must be registered.
- 10. The club must submit the Workshop Report form to the ACACA Treasurer within 30 days of the completion or funds will be revoked.

*Any ACACA member or group of members that do not belong to a club may apply for this Workshop Grant, but must be pre-approved by the ACACA Board and must follow the same criteria as a club.
