### Membership Renewal on ACACA Website

There have been a few questions asked about the application for membership on the ACACA *Website*.

When you go to *Membership*, there will be a drop down for *Renew/Become a Member* online. Once you click on that bar, another dropdown will show that says *Online Individual/Club Application*. The membership form will appear.

Click on <u>all</u> fields to see what is in the field and what needs filled in. Once you have everything filled in, click on *Submit*. This will take you to a method of payment *PayPal* and below it *Credit Card Payment*. If you do not have a PayPal Account, do not worry, as you can click on *Credit Card Payment* and the information is there for you to fill in for that payment. You will receive an email to confirm you have made the payment.

As well, in that same section of Membership, there will be a dropdown that says *Donate*. If you would like to make a donation to ACACA you can click on that dropdown and fill in the application for the donation. When you get to the amount you want to donate (shows \$10), click on that amount in the bar and there will be an additional listing of various amounts that could be used.

As with membership application, you will then click on submit and be directed to pay either by PayPal or Credit Card. Again, you will be sent an email to confirm your payment.

### **Congratulations Doreen Stachniak**



Doreen was presented with the *ACACA Penny Volk Award* by former ACACA Vice President Debbie Cameron-Laninga at her local art club.

Doreen was nominated for her outstanding volunteer work and support of the ACACA.

In 1988 Doreen founded the Redwater Art Society, and shortly after, the club joined ACACA.

The original name was 'Athabasca Landing Trail Society'. Right from the early beginning, she taught many workshops at the local school and community events. It was during these early years professor Harry Wohlfarth would ride the bus out to Redwater and spend weekends at the studio with all the local artists.

The society would host many Plein-Air days throughout the area, with several taking place at the local golf course, food bank, and other town-held events. Quite a few of Doreen's paintings were donated and used in raffles and fundraisers, and many others sold – so she a quite a collection of photos of her work..

Starting out as a hobby, Doreen has been painting since the early 60's. In 1991, Doreen received the *Juror's Choice Award* AND the *Lillian Nunn Scholarship Award* at the Red Deer Alberta Wide ACACA Show.

In 1994, Professor Harry Wohlfarth, presented Doreen with the *Constance McFarlane Scholarship Award* at the Faculty of Extention at U of A. He recognized her from a class in 1963!

Also in 1994, Doreen received the *President's Award* at the ACACA Red Deer Alberta Wide Show for her watercolour '*Hauzenberger's Haven*'. This painting was also purchased to become part of the government's permanent collection.

In 1998, The Redwater Art Society, with Doreen as president, hosted its

first of two shows, so far, for ACACA. It was very successful as many of the paintings were sold throughout that weekend. The second show was held in 2014 for which she received a Certificate of Appreciation for volunteer hours.

The 2004 ACACA cordially invited Doreen to the opening ceremonies of the Alberta-Wide 25th Anniversary Show in Red Deer

Doreen has continued to be a huge part of the Redwater Art Society and all its shows and exhibits. She has always made sure the club is involved in all of our community's events and functions, has instructed numerous classes in a variety of techniques and often lends her time and skills to

both our elementary school and high school. Doreen devotes her time to researching new opportunities for artists of all ages and encourages our local youth to take part and hone their talents.

When Doreen discovered my daughter Sofia's work at the age of 14, it was because of her she joined the RAS and particularly the ACACA. Doreen encouraged her to enter her work in the ACACA Northern Zone show a few years back at which she was very

### Reflections on Our Anniversary Year

The final event of our 100 Year Anniversary celebrations took place on January 20, 2022 at the Art Gallery of Alberta and gave me pause for reflection. Eight of our current members, one new member, and several members of the public came together to hear comments on the work presented from guest critic Emily Jan (www.emilyjan.com), an instructor in the Studio Arts department of MacEwan University. Attendees also provided feedback.


This was a wonderful final event for our anniversary year. When we initially began planning to celebrate we had no idea that we would be in the midst of a pandemic and how drastically that would impact our plans. After a great deal of discussion and brainstorming we identified three areas of focus: a mural, which could include all members in its production; a commemorative book, including our history and profiles of current members; and an exhibition partnership with the Art Gallery of Alberta (AGA).

#### The Mural



Jani Galarneau and Seraya Smit lead us through the mural creation. The finished product was displayed across from the elevator doors of the AGA Community Gallery as part of the EAC members' show. Forty-four members painted the ninety-six 6" birch tiles in the mural, which was then finished with two coats of resin, framed, and prepared for hanging.

#### The Book



Our commemorative book, Edmonton Art Club A Century of Mark Making 1921 - 2021, was compiled by a book committee including Ted Widen, Seraya Smit, Betty Dean, Jani Galarneau, Rhea Jansen and Connie Clarke. Connie worked with ATB to develop a show and fundraising campaign and Ted compiled the pages and worked with College Copy to ensure successful printing. Content was drawn from our historical documents, well organized and maintain by Johanne Septou, our current club historian, and club historians of the past. Our historical files were shared with the

AGA as they developed the retrospective show. The book includes a brief history of the club, honouring our past, the remarkable vision of our fourteen founders, and some of our journey to today. A significant portion of the book is devoted to work by current members of the EAC, including a copy of the work each member selected to for our AGA Community Gallery show. Also on each member's pages are photos of the tiles each painted for our mural, a photo of the artist and a brief biography. A photo of the mural we created is included, along with two legends detailing who painted which tiles. In our description of where we are today, we've included some details of our remarkable relationship with the Art Gallery of Alberta.

#### The AGA Exhibition Partnership

An initial show proposal had been sent to the AGA in 2017. We used that proposal as a starting point for discussions and were encouraged by their response. Curator and Collections Manager Danielle Siemens, with others, helped us finalize details of two shows:

- The Edmonton Art Club A Century of Mark Making 1921 2021, which ran from October 30, 2021 to January 23, 2022:
- Making Art, Building Community: 100 Years of the Edmonton Art Club, which opened on November 6, 2021

Because of COVID closures, the opening of the shows was delayed several times. Once final opening dates were established, several special events were planned. The opening reception, held November 5, had limited attendance because of COVID restrictions. A curated members' tour of Making Art, Building Community was held on November 24, and our final event was the recent Critique Night.

We were pleased to receive a grant from the Edmonton Arts Council to support advertising and social media posts promoting our shows. Using the art of Andrew Bedingfield, Nola Bukvi, Linda Nelson and Aeris Osborne several promotions were developed and will run until March 13, 2022 when the show closes.

2021 was a year to remember, and to reflect upon and celebrate the foresight of the fourteen founding members, on the part we can each play to build our future, and on the very real benefits of



### **Alberta Community Art Clubs Association**

The Lillian Nunn Scholarship is funded by an estate donation to the Faculty of Extension at the University of Alberta program by the late Lillian Nunn of Lacombe, AB. She was a member of the Alberta Community Art Clubs

Association (ACACA) until her death in 1982. It was her bequest to provide scholarships to active ACACA members 50 years of age or older to assist with the furthering of their art education.

#### - ELIGIBILITY -

Preference will be given to students 50 years of age or older, who are members in good standing with the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association (ACACA).

#### - CRITERIA -

Individuals may be awarded a Lillian Nunn Scholarship by one of two methods:

- The Instructors of the Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program will submit the names and portfolios of persons who have excelled in these courses and who meet the age and ACACA membership requirements.
  - These portfolios will consist of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).
- ACACA members who meet the age requirement but are not enrolled in a Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program may apply for this scholarship by completing an application form and submitting a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).

#### - SCHOLARSHIP -

Scholarships are available annually in an amount of no less than \$300, no more than \$600.

- Accredited faculty members at the U of A Faculty of Extension will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- Successful scholarship recipients of the Lillian Nunn Scholarship will be notified directly from Communications & Design, Faculty of Extension, University of Alberta.

Members in good standing who have received any other scholarships or grants allocated through the ACACA in the past fiscal year are not eligible to apply in the year they have been recipients of other funding.

#### **CRITERIA**

Members who meet the eligibility requirements to be considered for an ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grant must:

- 1. complete the application form;
- 2. provide a current artist resume or CV;
- 3. attach a personal statement detailing why this grant is being applied for and how the funds will be used,
- 4. submit a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed in the last 1-2 years (digital files or photos of the works are permissible for application purposes).

#### **GRANT**

Three (3) ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grants are available in each fiscal year (March 1 - February 28) in the amount of \$400.00 each.

- · An accredited, non-partisan jury panel chosen by CARFAC Alberta will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- The ACACA Executive Board will review and confirm eligibility criteria of the applicants.
- Successful ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grant recipients will be notified by the ACACA Executive Board by December 31 and grant funds will be issued at that time.

### **Grant Criteria and Information**

Art Clubs\* that are members of the ACACA are entitled to four (4) workshop grants PER ZONE, per fiscal year in the amount of \$400.00. This grant includes paint-outs with instruction.

NOTE: This Application Form must by reviewed and approved by the ACACA Executive, please review the Application form carefully.

#### **Club Workshop Grant Criteria and Information**

- 1. Four workshops or paint-outs per zone will be entitled to a \$400 grant in each fiscal year, if the following criteria are
- 2. The Club must be a paid member and have hosted a Zone Show in the last ten (10) years.
- 3. a) Application deadline is July 31 of each year, late applications will be denied.
- b) Applications will be processed in the order that they were received.
- 4. Preference will be given to clubs planning some sort of outreach beyond their membership.
- 5. A club or local group must be willing to accept responsibility for advertising, bookings, handling registrations, guaranteeing class size, providing overnight accommodation for instructor and securing local grant(s) if
- 6. Some kind of outreach is encouraged, for example: invitations should be extended to persons from the community, older students in school and interested seniors.
- 7. ACACA's sponsorship of the Workshop should be noted by having ACACA promotional materials available and given to the participants.
- 8. Applicants must submit the Workshop Grant Application form to the ACACA Treasurer for review and approval.
- 9. A minimum of eight (8) participants must be registered.
- 10. The club must submit the Workshop Report form to the ACACA Treasurer within 30 days of the completion or funds will be revoked.

\*Any ACACA member or group of members that do not belong to a club may apply for this Workshop Grant, but must be pre-approved by the ACACA Board and must follow the same criteria as a club.
