VICE-PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

s Vice-President and representative for the ACACA, it was my privilege to attend the two ACACA Zone Shows, one on the last weekend of May in St. Paul for the North, and the other in Duchess on the first weekend of June for the South. This was my first time at such events, and I must admit that I learned a lot about the organization and the membership that make these events possible.

Both shows were equally engaging, entertaining, and educational. They each brought their local communities closer together by offering a visual feast of artworks in a variety of styles and media that culminated in ACACA award ceremonies where individual artists were recognized for their best-in-category achievement. I know I had the best job there, which was the opening remarks, handing out awards and, of course, congratulating all the winners.

It takes many volunteers to put these events together, and I must thank two people in particular: the North Zone representative, Hans Rohner and South Zone representative, Linda Milne, who got the communities involved from the mayors to the students. Two notable firsts, and great steps forward for the ACACA, were

one, that artists from surrounding First Nation communities were invited to participate in the North Zone Show through the efforts and negotiations of Hans Rohner, and two, that students from the community and surrounding areas participated in an exhibition that ran alongside the North Zone Show. These firsts brought greater interest in the ACACA, and are models to build upon in coming years, eventually representing the diversity of Alberta communities more accurately.

There are many, many moving parts in such events and the one who keeps all those moving parts well greased was Linda LaRochelle, the current ACACA treasurer. Linda also took on the role of exhibition development. Each of these individuals have worked hard to make these events the success they were.

They will each have their own stories to tell. What I can say as a first-time participant is that I really loved meeting all the dignitaries, the artists, the jurors, the Board members who were there, and the people who live and make art in those communities.





Lillian Nunn Scholarship

FOR QUALIFYING MEMBER ARTISTS OVER 50 YEARS OF AGE



Alberta Community Art Clubs Association

The Lillian Nunn Scholarship is funded by an estate donation to the Faculty of Extension at the University of Alberta program by the late Lillian Nunn of Lacombe, AB. She was a member of the Alberta Community Art Clubs

Association (ACACA) until her death in 1982. It was her bequest to provide scholarships to active ACACA members 50 years of age or older to assist with the furthering of their art education.

- ELIGIBILITY -

Preference will be given to students 50 years of age or older, who are members in good standing with the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association (ACACA).

- CRITERIA -

Individuals may be awarded a Lillian Nunn Scholarship by one of two methods:

- 1. The Instructors of the Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program will submit the names and portfolios of persons who have excelled in these courses and who meet the age and ACACA membership requirements.
 - These portfolios will consist of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).
- 2. ACACA members who meet the age requirement but are not enrolled in a Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program may apply for this scholarship by completing an application form and submitting a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).

- SCHOLARSHIP -

Scholarships are available annually in an amount of no less than \$300, no more than \$600.

- Accredited faculty members at the U of A Faculty of Extension will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- Successful scholarship recipients of the Lillian Nunn Scholarship will be notified directly from Communications & Design, Faculty of Extension, University of Alberta.

Members in good standing who have received any other scholarships or grants allocated through the ACACA in the past fiscal year are not eligible to apply in the year they have been recipients of other funding.

- 2. provide a current artist resume or CV;
- 3. attach a personal statement detailing why this grant is being applied for and how the funds will be used,
- 4. submit a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed in the last 1-2 years (digital files or photos of the works are permissible for application purposes).

GRANT

Three (3) ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grants are available in each fiscal year (March 1 - February 28) in the amount of \$400.00 each.

- · An accredited, non-partisan jury panel chosen by CARFAC Alberta will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- The ACACA Executive Board will review and confirm eligibility criteria of the applicants.
- Successful ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grant recipients will be notified by the ACACA Executive Board by December 31 and grant funds will be issued at that time.

Art Clubs* that are members of the ACACA are entitled to four (4) workshop grants PER ZONE, per fiscal year in the amount of \$400.00. This grant includes paint-outs with instruction.

NOTE: This Application Form must by reviewed and approved by the ACACA Executive, please review the Application form carefully.

Club Workshop Grant Criteria and Information

- 1. Four workshops or paint-outs per zone will be entitled to a \$400 grant in each fiscal year, if the following criteria are
- 2. The Club must be a paid member and have hosted a Zone Show in the last ten (10) years.
- 3. a) Application deadline is July 31 of each year, late applications will be denied.
- b) Applications will be processed in the order that they were received.
- 4. Preference will be given to clubs planning some sort of outreach beyond their membership.
- 5. A club or local group must be willing to accept responsibility for advertising, bookings, handling registrations, guaranteeing class size, providing overnight accommodation for instructor and securing local grant(s) if
- 6. Some kind of outreach is encouraged, for example: invitations should be extended to persons from the community, older students in school and interested seniors.
- 7. ACACA's sponsorship of the Workshop should be noted by having ACACA promotional materials available and given to the participants.
- 8. Applicants must submit the Workshop Grant Application form to the ACACA Treasurer for review and approval.
- 9. A minimum of eight (8) participants must be registered.
- 10. The club must submit the Workshop Report form to the ACACA Treasurer within 30 days of the completion or funds will be revoked.

*Any ACACA member or group of members that do not belong to a club may apply for this Workshop Grant, but must be pre-approved by the ACACA Board and must follow the same criteria as a club.

The AFA reports to Alberta's Minister of Culture, Multiculturalism and Status of Women and is guided by the objectives found in the Alberta Foundation for the Arts Act, 1991.
