
All shows are juried and you will meet wonderful artists of all specialties and levels. So if you are an EAC member or a member of another Alberta Art Club you may want to sign up for a membership and take advantage of this financial opportunity, at https://acaca.ab.ca/grants-scholarships/.

There are also categories of expertise, such as Youth (ages 15-18 years old) Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced, Master, and Signature levels. Being a long-time educator who has seen many Teacher Conventions across the province I know that each

convention features student art. These students are usually from high school Art Programs and this would be a fabulous opportunity and connection for our talented art students. Also, those who are older than 18 could apply at 19 years of age, with no formal art training.

These are amazing art connections for our emerging artists. Please share this information with the schools near you. This fun fact is that after the great success of the Alberta Wide Art Show, August 2022, held in Camrose, the Mayor of Camrose stated that August in Camrose was Art Month. 



Meet Bob Franz - ACACA Historian

Bob was born in Coleman, now part of the Municipality of the Crowsnest Pass, and currently is a long-time resident of Brooks, Alberta, where he has resided since August, 1981. After a forty-year career in Education, he retired in 2005.

Bob's interest in art began as a child but was put aside to earn a living and raise a family. Bob married his childhood sweetheart, Grace, with whom he recently celebrated their fifty-fourth wedding anniversary. They have two children and two grandchildren and have outlived six cats. They are presently enjoying cat number seven 'Mister Awesome Rainbow Kitty' (Mark for short).

Five years after retirement, Bob turned to graphite art as one of several hobbies. Bob is selftaught, relying on art books and magazines, trial and error, a diligent routine, and many hours of practice. He uses a blended pencil technique based on the work of former Kansas illustrator and police artist Lee Hammond. In September he enrolled in the online Drawing Academy founded by the British fine artist Vladimir London, where he is learning classical art technique. Bob's work is noted primarily for its fine detail and realism. His work has been compared to that of Albrecht Durer, the renowned artist and printmaker of the German Renaissance and one of the first European landscape artists, and to Jean Paul Lemieux, one of Canada's foremost painters

of the twentieth century from Quebec.

Last winter Bob embarked on a new venture, metalpoint, and has produced several art pieces in silverpoint, the medium used by Renaissance artists, including Durer, before the creation of graphite.

Bob's artwork reflects his varied other interests, including historical art, landscapes and wildlife from his boyhood home in the Crowsnest Pass, his current home in Brooks, and his extensive camping and sightseeing travels from coast to coast across Canada and the United States; scenes from science fiction and high fantasy which he also writes as a hobby, and anything else he sees as a challenge.

Bob was a founding member of the local Sage Brush Arts Society where he served as Director. President, Secretary and Vice-President. His first public showing was by invitation for the Brooks Centennial Celebration in 2010 and his first solo exhibit was at the Brooks Public Library in 2013. He had a dual presentation 'My Crowsnest Pass: Impressions by Two Distinguished Gentlemen' with the late local artist Richard Wood in 2014 and his latest solo exhibit was 'Images of Canada' at the Brooks Campus of Medicine Hat College featuring fortyeight sketches representing the official symbols and landscapes of Canada's ten provinces and three territories in commemoration of Canada's 150 th anniversary.

55 Plus Association Alberta Summer Games in Barrhead, the prestigious Jean Stevenson Award at the 2017 Alberta Wide ACACA show in Sherwood Park for his piece 'Boy', the ACACA Northern Zone Show Award in Edmonton in 2019 for his piece 'Eugene' which was subsequently exhibited in the Alberta Spirit Show at the CARFAC Center in Edmonton, and most recently the Harry Wohlfath Drawing Award for his piece 'Dorian—a Study in Shades of Grey' which was exhibited at the Alberta Spirit Show at the Kiwanis Gallery in Red Deer.

Bob is a member of the local Crow Buttes Artists group and of the Alberta Communities Art Clubs Association and his foray into cubism, 'Balls, Bees, Birds, Boobs, Bull' won him the judge's recommendation that he move up into the Masters Category in the Association. He recently joined the ACACA executive as Historian.



The Lillian Nunn Scholarship is funded by an estate donation to the Faculty of Extension at the University of Alberta program by the late Lillian Nunn of Lacombe, AB. She was a member of the Alberta Community Art Clubs

Association (ACACA) until her death in 1982. It was her bequest to provide scholarships to active ACACA members 50 years of age or older to assist with the furthering of their art education.

- ELIGIBILITY -

Preference will be given to students 50 years of age or older, who are members in good standing with the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association (ACACA).

- CRITERIA -

Individuals may be awarded a Lillian Nunn Scholarship by one of two methods:

- The Instructors of the Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program will submit the names and portfolios of persons who have excelled in these courses and who meet the age and ACACA membership requirements.
 - These portfolios will consist of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).
- ACACA members who meet the age requirement but are not enrolled in a Faculty of Extension Visual Arts Program may apply for this scholarship by completing an application form and submitting a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work completed within the last 1-2 years (photos or digital files of the works are permissible for application purposes).

- SCHOLARSHIP -

Scholarships are available annually in an amount of no less than \$300, no more than \$600.

- Accredited faculty members at the U of A Faculty of Extension will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- Successful scholarship recipients of the Lillian Nunn Scholarship will be notified directly from Communications & Design, Faculty of Extension, University of Alberta.

GRANT

Three (3) ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grants are available in each fiscal year (March 1 - February 28) in the amount of \$400.00 each.

- · An accredited, non-partisan jury panel chosen by CARFAC Alberta will assess the applications and jury the submitted portfolios.
- The ACACA Executive Board will review and confirm eligibility criteria of the applicants.
- Successful ACACA Individual Member Workshop Grant recipients will be notified by the ACACA Executive Board by December 31 and grant funds will be issued at that time.

- 2. The Club must be a paid member and have hosted a Zone Show in the last ten (10) years.
- 3. a) Application deadline is July 31 of each year, late applications will be denied.
- b) Applications will be processed in the order that they were received.
- 4. Preference will be given to clubs planning some sort of outreach beyond their membership.
- 5. A club or local group must be willing to accept responsibility for advertising, bookings, handling registrations, guaranteeing class size, providing overnight accommodation for instructor and securing local grant(s) if
- 6. Some kind of outreach is encouraged, for example: invitations should be extended to persons from the community, older students in school and interested seniors.
- 7. ACACA's sponsorship of the Workshop should be noted by having ACACA promotional materials available and given to the participants.
- 8. Applicants must submit the Workshop Grant Application form to the ACACA Treasurer for review and approval.
- 9. A minimum of eight (8) participants must be registered.
- 10. The club must submit the Workshop Report form to the ACACA Treasurer within 30 days of the completion or funds will be revoked.

*Any ACACA member or group of members that do not belong to a club may apply for this Workshop Grant, but must be pre-approved by the ACACA Board and must follow the same criteria as a club.
